The purpose of this project was to correct drainage problems on a vacant lot in the Gardens of Hartland neighborhood; saturated ground was making maintenance of lot difficult. The end result of project would allow 90% of storm water entering this site to be filtered / treated with the use of Native & Non-Invasive Species; Native planting plugs will take 2-3 years to mature. This would also correct an existing storm water infrastructure issue to allow water to flow from a neighboring detention area. OAG completed a Stormwater Incentive Grant write up through LFUCG's new Stormwater Incentive Grant program. This program was developed to focus on four element associated with storm water issues: reducing amount of storm water, improving quality, educating, and public awareness. This allowed funding for the project possible through an 80/20 match between the HOA and LFUCG and in turn drastically improving this area. Currently OAG is performing ongoing maintenance as well as monitoring quality of water entering & exiting site through water samples testing.
